5 Points Each

- Have your child take a practice phonogram test and practice missed phonograms. **Practice test needs to be turned in.**
- Have your child write a story with **a minimum of three sentences**. This could be a personal narrative, a creative writing, or non fiction/report-like writing on a topic that interests them. Sentences should have neat writing, proper capitalization and punctuation, spacing, and good (not perfect) spelling. **A neat, detail oriented picture, MUST be included. Paper needs to be turned in.**
- Students have learned many different types of writing. They often enjoy writing lists of things. Please have your child write a list of five items for each of the following topics: ***Five Favorite Fruits. Five Favorite Ways to Sharpen the Saw (They know what this is). Five Cute Animals.*** Students should write the title of the list, then include at least five items on a numbered list. **Paper needs to be turned in.**

2 Points Each

- Practice writing or reading phonograms for ten minutes. **Paper needs to be turned in.**
- Write 20 math problems for your child to solve: mixing up adding and subtracting. The kindergarten standard is to stay within 10, but many advanced students can try harder problems by using counting strategies. **Paper needs to be turned in.**
- Write ten addition problems with THREE addends (i.e. $2+3+5=$ ____). **Paper needs to be turned in.**
- Write down three numbers in order, with the middle number blank (i.e. 4, ____, 6). Have your child write the missing number. Repeat for ten sets of numbers. You can make the numbers as challenging as your child needs. **Paper needs to be turned in.**
- Read along with a story on Tumblebooks.com. (user name theacademy. password: books). What book(s) did you listen to?
